

REQUEST FOR INDOOR RANGE P.I.N. — \$5.00

Read the Rules and Regulations below. Sign the bottom (either in person, or acknowledge your receipt, reading and agreement via e-mail) and return. This must be accomplished prior to receiving your Personal Identification Number.

Sign the log and note ALL calibers that you will be using and if you brought a guest. The PIN number is your own PIN number. If you entered the range, without signing in, you will be contacted. After three instances of failing to sign the log your range privileges will be revoked, and you will have to come before the E Board to have then reinstated.

Do not let other members “piggy back” on your PIN. If another shooter arrives to shoot, make sure they enter their PIN. If damage was done to the range and your PIN is the only PIN logged, you will be contacted.

DO NOT use steel BB's or magnum cartridges on the Indoor Range. Any NON-MAGNUM handgun cartridge and .22 cal. rimfire rifles are permitted for use on the Indoor Range. Center-fire ammo must not exceed 1300 f.p.s (feet per second). Note that all center-fire rifles and rifle cartridges (e.g., .223, .30 carbine, .30-30 and .45-70) are prohibited, even when fired from a handgun. If you are unsure whether your ammo qualifies for indoor use, it is your responsibility to verify its status before shooting; check with the Chief Range Safety Officer.

- Only paper targets are allowed when using the Indoor Range. All targets must be placed at the end of the target carriers travel so all rounds will enter the target backstop.
- All shooters must stand behind the benches at the stations. Shooting is not allowed from a position down range.
- Maximum size of a paper target for the indoor range is 14” x 14”, no full size silhouettes or targets that hang down past the lower retaining wall.
- Clean up all empty shell casings and dispose of any brass shells in the container provided. A dust pan and broom are provided.
- Place any “squibs” or malfunctioning ammo in the container filled with oil in the Indoor Range.
- When finished using the Indoor Range, make sure the range lights and exhaust fan is shut off, and the range door locks behind you.

After submitting this form with your \$5.00 fee and prior to being issued your Indoor Range PIN, you will be notified when your Gun Safety Skills Review is scheduled. You will also receive full details of all the items to be reviewed during that process.

If you are not accurate enough to insure that your shots are hitting the proper area on the backstop, do not shoot in the range. If your shots regularly hit the plate above the target area, the walls, the plates protecting the lights or the retaining wall at the bottom of the range, then stop shooting immediately. There are many club members who would be glad to help you improve your accuracy. Contact the Chief Range Safety Officer to arrange instruction.
